


Goals

# Achievements

Direct participation in the process to include biotech drugs into the social security system. In this process, rheumatologists make requests for medicines, and FUNARP, through active participation in public policy advocacy, managed etanercept and adalimumab enter the official list of medicines of the Social Led the legalization of medical cannabis since 2019, actively participating in consultative committees in the legislative body of Panama, actively exposing the need of patients with chronic pain, including articles that are part of Law 242 of October 13, 2021, as well as in the regulation of this through Executive Decree 121 of September 1, 2022

### Since 2010

Successfully procured health programs to provide biotech medicines to patients without coverage in the Social Security Fund program (low-income patients who obtain their medical care in facilities run by the Ministry of Health) Permanent member of the High-Level Commission for the Improvement of the Health System (CAN) - body created by Executive Decree 214 of May 2012, as an advisor to the Ministry of Health.

This commission, after intense work, delivered recommendations to the President of Panama, consigned in a document called "White Book" Principal position with voice and vote in the Commission for Critical Drug Shortage, the National Observatory of Medicines, and the Commission of Non-substitutable Medicines.


All these instances are run by the Ministry of Health. It also participates in the main role with the right to speak in the Commission of Evaluation of the Processes of Purchase of Medicines of the Social Security Fund.

Direct participation in the formation of the Rare Diseases Network of Panama (REDER).

Main participation and patient representative with voice and vote in the Technical Commission of Medicines led by the Vice President of Panama. Commission created in Feb'22 to promote concrete actions for improvement of the medicine supply processes in the country through the Ministry of Health and the Social Security Fund.

Key achievement: automation and control of the process of reception and delivery of medicines in the Social Security Fund. Through this automation, it will be possible to have real consumption figures that will allow for better medicine purchases.

> Creation of the first medical-patient congress in Panama where rheumatologists updated first-level physicians (general and pediatric) on rheumatic diseases.
